Tax Filing Requirement – 990 Form

Filing Deadline – Novemeber 15th – Annual Electronic Filing Requirment for Exchange Clubs <u>www.irs.gov/990n</u>

CALIFORNIA EXCHANGE CLUBS – Please use the following number when filing with the State of California Franchise Tax Board: 3657592.

Exchange Clubs are required to electronically submit Form 990-N, also known as the e-Postcard, unless they choose to file a



complete Form 990 or Form 990-EZ.

Clubs that file a form 990-N, the e-Postcard, should also submit a scanned copy to financial@nationalexchangeclub.org. Any club that fails to file the requeired e-Postcad (or information returns) for three consective years will automatically lose its tax-exempt status. The revocation will be immediate.

Legacy of the Year Award

The National Exchange Club's Legacy of the



Year Award recognizes high school students who are children or grandchildren of veteran and first responder Exchange Club members. Candidates also display

exceptional community involvement and leadership skills. This program rewards outstanding young people and provides incentive for others to serve their country and communities. Legacy of the Year Award candidates will submit applications directly to Exchange's

National Headquarters. If an Exchange Club or District chooses to implement this program, they may do so and coordinate this award similar to the popular Youth of the Year and A.C.E. of the Year Scholarship programs.

PURPOSE:

The Legacy of the Year Award recognizes high school students whose Exchange Club members are parents/grandparents of first responders or veterans. This is a positive program with two key objectives: it helps encourage students to continue with community involvement and leadership; and, it recognizes students who have knowledge and experience regarding the sacrifices made for community and country. This

special recognition serves as a powerful awareness to all students that it is an honorable action to serve our communities and country, thus making our communities better places to live. The submission deadline for the national Legacy of the Year Award is June 1. The winner will be presented the Legacy of the Year Award and a \$15,000 scholarship at Exchange's annual National Convention. Travel accommodations will be provided to the winner and the parents/guardians.

CANDIDATE SUBMISSIONS:

- 1. Contact Exchange Club members who are first responders and veterans, to make them aware of this award.
- Exchange Clubs may also choose to position this award as an incentive for joining.
- 3. Ensure the candidate will graduate from high school this year, OR complete GED classes by the age of 19 and by the time of submission of application to National Headquarters (June 1).
- 4. Obtain school official and parent/guardian signatures.
- 5. Submit the candidate's essays before the deadline.
- 6. Submit essay about the candidate before the deadline. The essay may be submitted by parent, grandparent, or school official.
- 7. Advise candidate that they may be contacted by a representative of The National Exchange Club to obtain additional information for publicity purposes.

Clubs in the News

Irvine The program year kicks off in November with the Thanksgiving Prayer Breakfast. The attendance to this event has been steadily rising year over year. A new Freedom Shrine at Portola High School is in the works.

Preparation for the Irvine Police Department's Award Banquet has started. It is held in March. The club's participation with the O.C. Best and Bravest is unknown at this time because the firefighter's association wants more involvement, etc. The club continues to participate in an on-going bi-monthly BBQ gathering at the Veteran's Outpost organized by the Tustin Exchange Club. The A.C.E. dates for this year are December and March scheduled with Creekside High School. The Excellence in Teaching event will be held in April, a date forthcoming, and held at the same venue as last year, the Barclay Theatre.

Tustin The club continues with the monthly BBQ at the Veteran's Outpost in Tustin. The club has started a monthly birthday party for children at the OC Rescue Mission. The club recently had a birthday party for the children at the City of Hope. The club hosted an Honor a Hero Event on September 7th honoring two first responders who went to New York to help with the 911 terrorists attack. Angie Kardashian sold her restaurant and went to New York to cook for firefighters for two years following the 911 attack. The other recipient is a veteran Jesus Lozacruz. He received a brand-new VW 7seater SUV donated by Sterling Collision Center, Joe Kazemi and Capistrano VW. The club donated \$5,000 to the OCFA Benevolent Association for fallen firefighters' children. October 5 the club will host a Tustin Tiller Day Pancake Breakfast. A Flamingo Bingo event was held last month which raised \$4,000 given to the Tustin Police Association for Homeless Kids. This club continues to make a huge impact on fundraising for special projects and needs in the community. The club gained six new members between February – March, 2019. **Crossroads** The club holds 6 Youth of the Month programs throughout the year for four Irvine high schools. The next programs will be in October through May, 2020. The club will also host a Youth of the Year program recognizing all the Youth of the Month honorees. The Youth of the Year winners from each high school are submitted to the District Youth of the Year Program. These are continuous, on-going programs the club is committed to. The club is a small group but does a wonderful, committed job with the Youth of the Month and Year programs!

Newport Harbor The Newport Harbor Club continues to be busy with anti-trafficking programs, specifically supporting and piloting a documentary film aimed at national distribution. The target audience is school personnel, nurses, and students. The club is gearing up for the second of two of their largest programs, Movie Night. George Lesley, Chair of the event is in search of another blockbuster movie to draw in the crowds. This event raises thousands of dollars every year. The club also participates in the Youth of the Year programs. Their movie



night event is very popular and is one of their key money raising programs.

San Jose - The Club is active in a number of projects, including an annual Christmas Party for underprivileged kids. They participated in the 4th of July Parade and there, conducted a Giveakidaflagtowave project.

San Ramon - Remains the flagship club of the division, with large membership. They have conducted numerous projects, including annual 9/11 celebration/recognition (best ever), accompanied by an essay contest for students, is in the process of renovation of the club website & brochure/publicity posters to be posted in conspicuous locations.
