A.C.E. Winner Uriel Reyes Mateos

The California-Nevada District Exchange Club is proud to present our Male ACE Award winner, Uriel Reyes Mateos. He has determination, focus, and a tremendous work ethic. Despite the challenge of attending school that runs longer hours daily and yearly, and traveling an hour to arrive and a significantly longer time returning home, Uriel dedicated his time and energy to overcoming these obstacles for the goal of graduating high school and attending college. He did so with a 4.09 GPA because of his drive to succeed. He also did volunteer work every year while attending school and completed eight AP-level classes.



His parents early were unable to assist in his education having had their own schooling cut short at the age of 8. Uriel fortunately participated in English Language Development classes as English was his second language. Throughout his education he was riddled with fears about being accepted at college as he was "undocumented." He feared being a burden to his parents and family were he unable to work and pay for an education that he might never be able to get. His life has been riddled by discrimination far beyond the average Hispanic student, both at home and in the world at large. His future plans direct his attention to this problem

in the world. His persistence and determination will be his support in this arena.

The ACE Award addresses the challenges of life for the students who persevere despite these obstacles. According to his Advisory Teacher, "His dedication to education and making the future for himself serves as an example for other students." Especially during these unprecedented difficult times, we are honored and proud to assist Uriel in achieving his dreams of completing college and becoming a positive force in our community.

A.C.E. Winner Natalie Varela Mares

The California-Nevada District Exchange Club is proud to present Natalie Varela Mares as our Female ACE Award winner for 2020.

Natalie attends a public charter school for low income students who strive to be the first in their families to graduate from college." So begins the recommendation from Natalie's University Prep12. The students face difficulties just getting to the campus as they come from all over San Diego County Two hours plus are common for transportation and the school hours are much longer than conventional schools. Students take 8 courses as opposed to the typical 6. Demands upon their time is high and Natalie is more than up to the challenge She has a cumulative 4.02 GPA. She has completed AP Spanish courses and is currently in her first year of



Mandarin. Because of her excellent ability in managing multiple responsibilities she has also been involved with a multitude of community projects since her freshman year. Among these projects are *I love a Clean San Diego, Sand Diego Canyon Lands, The Hunger Project, The Fleet Science Center,* and *The International Rescue Committee* at the campus. She has worked with the *Bio Scholars* program hosted by UC San Diego students at the school campus. She is also involved in community projects through her Church.

Natalie is being raised by a single mother. As a result, there have been a lot of financial problems which Natalie helped alleviate to some degree by getting a paid internship at Gap Factory store. She has learned about budgeting and wise spending. She is driven to achieve with a background of deprivation but hope with academic achievement. Her plans are to become an industrial designer to make a better community as well as to be an activist for positive change.

We are proud to assist Natalie, a woman of responsibility who strives to make the world a better place. She has character, and a strong sense of service. We present the scholarship to help make her dreams of a bright career and future come true. Her challenges and perseverance make her a great candidate for the ACE Award winner from our District.

Youth of the Year Erica Hsueh

Erica Hseuh was nominated as the California-Nevada District's 2020 Female Youth of the Year



by the Crossroads of Orange County Exchange Club. She was selected as Youth of the Year because she has demonstrated over the course of her high school years that she is an extraordinary person, student, classmate, leader, and teammate.

Erica recently graduated from Northwood High School in Irvine, California. She is fully prepared to assume even greater responsibilities and to accept the Privilege of Service that is the hallmark of EXCHANGE. Erica is quite accomplished in so many things it is hard to focus on just one thing. But there is one that deserves special mention.

She is the Founder & Chief Executive Director of the *Bytes of Code* program, which teaches STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) to disadvantaged girls not only in her community, but around the globe through ambassadors and online curriculum. She is most proud of this achievement. Her own words say it better than I can:

"With each workshop I host, *Bytes of Code* closes the gender gap in STEM. Comparing the students from day one—timid, shy, afraid to ask questions—to the end of the program showing off personal websites and demonstrating to their parents how they can command the Sphero robot to do whatever they want with a few lines of codes. I have seen these girls become more interested, confident, and comfortable with technology."

The public librarian commended Erica's program as a better alternative to other troubling activities available to these girls. That encouragement drives her to find interesting ways to entice them back to class. "I believe that gender under representation in STEM is a pervasive social problem that can be addressed first at the local level, beginning with individuals like myself."

We proudly support Erica in her future endeavors. America needs young people like her.

Youth of the Year Brendan Reeves

Brendan Reeves was nominated as the California-Nevada District's 2020 Male Youth of the Year by the South Orange County Exchange Club. He was selected as Youth of the Year because of his extraordinary accomplishments. Balance is a good word to describe Brendan Reeves. ART, ACADEMICS, SERVICE—all combine in Brendan to give him the creativity he finds in fulfilling himself, while helping others. It is rare indeed, to find a young man with such philosophic depth. Let Brendan tell it in his own words:

"Our third President and principal author of the Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson, maintained that the longevity of our Republic rests not only on the strengths of our institutions, but even more so on the "spirit of our people." This dual responsibility and necessity of Americans to be good citizens has remained constant throughout our nation's history. And this solemn obligation is still relevant now more than ever. Indeed, the responsible stewardship of American greatness ought not to be an abstraction relegated to a forgotten era of our country. Rather, I believe that every new generation of Americans is duty-bound to the same higher calling of citizenry as our forefathers. In keeping with this belief, I intend, now and in the future, to heed that call in the best way I know how - by unwaveringly leading the charge in helping others and by engaging fearlessly in American political discourse."

Brendan's essay shares some of the ways he lives out his commitment. For instance, he pours his passion for music into the *All-American Boys Chorus* which provides music curriculum to educate, motivate, and build character in boys ages 8-15. Who is better suited to fulfill a promise in our Covenant of Service: "To discharge the debt I owe to those of high and low estate who have served and sacrificed that the heritage of American citizenship might be mine. He is a remarkable young man!

I always tried to recognize the goodness in my peers, To give them praise for all the deeds that they have done for years.


My country meant so much to me, the red the white and blue For Patriotism I always stood, my flag I waved for you.

CAP CENTER UPDATE DURING THE AGE OF COVID-19

On March 15th everything changed for our Exchange Club Family Support Center. Due to a growing pandemic, as well as a government directive, the Center's Parent Aide Program's home visits and our Center-based Parenting Classes were immediately paused. Staff was thrust into a frenzy trying to get whatever food donations were available out to the families in one day (local markets were running extremely low on supplies due to panic buying). Staff was working to reassure families to ease fears of this unknown, unpredictable virus. Staff was working to help families navigate the stress of having their children suddenly being home full-time and enter the world of home-based schooling.

So as to maintain safety for Exchange Club Center staff, as well as carry out the "safer at home" order, Executive Director Georganne Bruce established a schedule of a single staff person in the office per day, Monday through Friday. With some additional staff time added toward the end of June, the schedule has mostly stayed the same and will be for the foreseeable future.



Case Management staff had done an exceptional job maintaining contact with Parent Aide client families. This had been quite challenge primarily using their Center-issued cell phones for twice weekly calls and video chats. In April, thanks to an emergency funding request written by the Center Director, Exchange Club of Newport Harbor provided a grant that allowed the purchase of three (3) laptops for the full-time Case Managers. This gift made a HUGE difference in the Center's service delivery. Home "visits" have continued, and the Center has, slowly, been taking referrals for new Parent Aide cases. Additionally, as of the first week of July and thanks to the laptops, the Center has restarted its parenting classes via Zoom. Most filled up within days of posting and class sizes are being kept small as we maneuver this new way of instruction.

The most incredible blessing of this stressful time has been the support of so many Exchange Clubs!! The unsolicited donations that came into the Center were, and continue to be, a huge help to the client families. Keeping in the practice of "no contact" these Exchange Club gifts allowed the Center to send e-gift cards to clients to assist with grocery needs. So many of our client families have been devastated financially when they were already working with limited resources. BIG SHOUT OUT TO Exchange Club of Downey, Exchange Club of Culver City, Exchange Club of Long Beach, South

Orange County Exchange Club, Exchange Club of Crossroads Orange County, Pacific Coast Exchange Club and Exchange Club of Newport Harbor.

EXCHANGE STRONG has truly been so evident with the level of Club support we have received! Yes, the financial gifts are appreciated more than words can express! But phone calls and emails of support and concern came in and kept coming in. **Pacific Coast Exchange Club** has resumed their monthly food and essential item donations. Back to School support is coming in even though our children will be experiencing a very different academic year, at least to start. The Exchange Club Family Support Center has found its way back to our new "normal" with much anticipation going forward.

On behalf of the Exchange Club Center staff, Board, and client families, THANK YOU EXCHANGE CLUB MEMBERS!!! It is because of Exchange that our CAP Center exists, changing the lives of family's day after

day. Give yourselves safe elbow bumps for all YOU DO, all YOU CONTRIBUTE, all YOUR SUPPORT to the success of our District's CAP Center!! Be safe and take care!
